

## CITY MANAGER'S WEEKLY UPDATE

### February 5, 2021

#### CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to further support social distancing and limitations on public gatherings, Governor Inslee issued [Proclamation 20-28](#) to temporarily address requirements of the state's Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) that require a physical location for the public to observe government meetings. This proclamation continues to be extended during the pandemic, and as a result City Council meetings are required to be held over the telephone or internet and the public must be able to hear the meeting live via telephone.

The City Council's next work/study session is on **Thursday, February 11, 2021 beginning at 7:00 p.m. via telephone and internet.** The agenda includes: (1) Review of Planning Commission's 2020 Accomplishments and 2021 Work Program (*Discussion with Planning Commission*); (2) Review of Engineering On-call Work Orders; (3) Discussion on Increasing the Number of Poultry Kept on Single Family Residential Properties; and (4) Discussion of Utility Discount for Low-Income Senior and Disabled Citizens.

The City Council's next regular meeting is on **Tuesday, February 16, 2021 beginning at 7:00 p.m. via telephone and internet.** The agenda includes: (1) Approval of Engineering On-call Work Orders; (2) Public Hearing and Consideration for Willow Glenn Preliminary Fee Simple Unit Lot Subdivision; and (3) Adoption of Ordinance to Amend Utility Rates Discount for Low-Income Senior and Disabled Citizens.

- **Community Listening Sessions with the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Commission:** The Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Commission is working on a postcard mailing for two upcoming community listening sessions that will take place on Wednesday, March 3 at 6:00 p.m. and Saturday, March 6 at 10:00 a.m. The postcards are anticipated to be mailed the week of February 22. - **Development Application Process:** During this stage of the COVID-19 pandemic the city is accepting building and other development applications through a ‘no-contact’ procedure. Permit applications are located on specific pages of the [website](#). Please be aware that compliance to COVID-19 mandates has created longer processing times for permits. \*The permit intake box is located by the door to City Hall on the second floor of the interior of the building. A permit specialist will be in contact with confirmation of receipt and invoice fees due to begin processing.

Your project must have issued permits on-site, require workers to be six feet apart, and have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan in order for inspections to occur. \*To schedule an inspection, call (425) 775-9694. Please have your permit number and address ready when you call.

*\*Washington State Department of Labor & Industries will enforce requirements for contractors to comply with comprehensive COVID-19 exposure control, mitigation, recovery plans and safety practices.*

## **FINANCE**

- **Relief Due to COVID-19 Emergency:** Since March 19, 2020, water service is not being shut off for residential customers' inability to pay during the COVID-19 emergency. The action remains in effect under the state's most recent proclamations addressing the pandemic. No late fees or penalties will apply during this time.

The service fee charged by the vendor for online utility payments has also been suspended for those choosing to pay online. The city recognizes that COVID-19 is a threat to the health of the community, and the ability to frequently wash our hands is paramount in the fight to curb the spread of the virus. As called for by the state and Snohomish Health District, this step will enable the community to ensure proper cleaning measures. ## **RECREATION, PARKS & PROPERTY MANAGEMENT**

- **Aquatics-Pool Schedule & Programming:** Swimming and fitness reservations continue to grow. Former aquatics staff who were laid off early in the pandemic are being contacted to get a sense of who will be returning, which will aid in evaluating when swimming lesson programs can begin.
- **Aquatic Boot Camp:** Plans are in the works to offer a third day of Aquatic Boot Camp on Friday mornings, beginning February 26.
- **Aquatics-Edmonds School District Swimming:** It has been confirmed that the Girls High School Swim Teams will start practices on February 22. The four Edmonds School District teams split their time between Lynnwood and Mountlake Terrace pools. Both pools will change schedules to accommodate the teams' practice times. Mountlake Terrace teams will practice from 2:45-4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday. To follow the current COVID regulations, teams will be limited to a specific number of swimmers, two coaches and no spectators. New schedules will be posted online and on Facebook in the coming weeks.
- **Aquatics Taking applications:** Aquatics is taking applications for employment for part-time Swim Instructors and Lifeguards to enable planning and offering programs in the future. Applications can be [submitted online](#).
- **Dog Obedience Classes:** The March sessions of Dog Obedience classes are available for registration online. Basic Dog Obedience, Beyond Basic Dog Obedience and Puppygarten classes have decreased maximums to adhere to the COVID guidelines. Should these classes be eligible to be held, they will begin the week of March 8.
- **Fitness:** Register anytime! Winter Virtual Fitness classes are in progress, broadcasted from the Pavilion to participants in their home. Online registration is ongoing. Having an affordable workout lead by our excellent instructors from the comfort and safety of your own home is one of the positive opportunities developed from our Stay Home & Stay Safe mandate. Yoga & Pilates are offered at a variety of times to fit into your schedule and no travel or shower are required!

- **Dance:** Join any time! Children and Adult Dance classes, taken via zoom from home, are proving to be a great choice while we have to follow state safety guidelines. Returning students are progressing in our full year curriculum in Ballet, Lyrical, Tap & Jazz and have kept their excitement and interest in dance this season. A new session will start in March. Keep checking the webpage to see when spring programs are posted and available for registration or enroll in the winter session and get started today! - **Ballfields:** Baseball is right around the corner and Parks staff are starting to prepare the grass and infield surfaces to be ready for opening. The grass fields have been closed during the winter months to give the turf a chance to rest and be in the best shape for the upcoming season. Preparation includes mowing, fertilizing, aeration, as well as adding a drying agent and leveling the skinned infields in conjunction with the Mountlake Terrace Youth Athletic Association (MTYAA).
- **Evergreen Playfield:** The Evergreen Playfield turf renovation project is still underway. The contractor, FieldTurf, is currently working on excavation and will start the drainage next week. Lights were installed last fall and the field construction should be completed by mid-spring.
- **Volunteers:** A small group of volunteers spread some wood chips at the dog park in January and another small group is scheduled to spread chips and do some invasive plant removal at the dog park on Saturday, February 6.
- **Adopt-a-Park Program:** Park staff is scheduled to meet with the "Friends of Ballinger" on Tuesday, February 9. The group is one of the first to apply for the city's Adopt-a-Park Program and will be working in the park throughout the summer.
- **Eagle Scout Project:** Eagle candidate Matthew LePere has contacted Park staff with an interest in completing an Eagle project in Mountlake Terrace parks. Matt has discussed the possible projects of installing a swing set, working with Seattle Disc Golf on the disc golf course at Terrace Creek, or installing Natural Growth Protection Area signs in Mountlake Terrace. Matt will consider the possible projects and submit a proposal once he has selected a final project.

### **POLICE DEPARTMENT**

- **Police Lobby Closed for Construction:** The Police Station lobby remains closed for all in-person business due to construction of the Police Station expansion/Civic Campus Redevelopment Project. Impacted services include in-person payments, fingerprinting services, and license renewals.

The public can conduct most business with the Police Department over the telephone, fax, or email as well as mail; however, fingerprinting services are suspended until further notice. **Weekly Patrol Synopsis**

- On January 27, patrol responded to a theft-from-vehicle report that was in progress at a residence located in the 6300 block of 232<sup>nd</sup> Street SW. Upon arrival, patrol apprehended the suspect in the victim's vehicle and arrested him for the offense. During a search incident to arrest he was found to be in possession of opioid-related narcotics paraphernalia. Due to heroin-related health issues, the suspect was released to medical personnel and transported to the hospital. Charges referred to the prosecutor for filing.
- On January 27, patrol responded to a disturbance at a business located in the 21900 block of Highway 99. Upon arrival, patrol contacted an intoxicated subject who was creating the disturbance and refusing to leave. Patrol trespassed him from the business and gave him a ride home.
- On January 27, patrol responded to a harassment report at a residence located in the 4400 block of 218<sup>th</sup> Street SW. The reporting person said she had been subject to telephone harassment for several months due to previous posts she made on social media.
- On January 27, patrol responded to a court order violation at the Studio 6 Motel. Investigation revealed the suspect was at the location in violation of a domestic violence protection order. The suspect was arrested for the offense and booked at the Lynnwood Jail without incident.
- On January 27, patrol responded to a theft-from-vehicle report at a residence located in the 4400 block of 228<sup>th</sup> Street SW. The reporting person stated merchandise worth several thousands of dollars was taken from the vehicle. There is no suspect information, investigation continues.
- On January 27, Officer Froisland and K9 Jax assisted the Lynnwood Police Department with a narcotics detection search.
- On January 27, patrol responded to a warrant service at a residence located in the 23100 block of 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. Patrol contacted the resident and arrested her for a Department of Corrections escape warrant. She was booked at the Snohomish County Jail without incident.
- On January 27, patrol responded to a court order violation in progress at a residence located in the 4700 block of 212<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Investigation revealed the reporting party had a domestic violence protection order preventing the father of her child from being at the residence. Prior to arrival the suspect fled and could not be located. Patrol continued to search for the suspect and located him a couple hours later driving a vehicle in the area. He was arrested for the offense and booked at the Snohomish County Jail without incident.

- On January 28, patrol responded to a theft report at a business located in the 22800 block of 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. The victim reported an unknown suspect stole her phone and wallet while she was distracted. Investigation continues.
- On January 28, patrol responded to a domestic disturbance at a residence located in the 22600 block of 73<sup>rd</sup> Place W. Investigation revealed the residents were arguing over money. One of the residents had multiple warrants for her arrest, however no agency confirmed the warrants, and the suspect was not arrested.
- On January 28, patrol contacted a suspicious vehicle at a business located in the 21200 block of 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. Investigation revealed one of the occupants had warrants for her arrest. She was arrested and booked at the Snohomish County Jail without incident.

The suspect had stopped in the road and accused the victim of tailgating. The suspect then exited his vehicle, confronted the victim, and threatened assault, repeatedly striking her vehicle and causing damage. The victim sprayed mace at the suspect, who then assaulted the victim. The fight was broken up by witnesses. The suspect fled in his vehicle and was not located. He was later contacted by phone, but refused to meet with police. Charges referred to the prosecutor for filing.
- On January 29, patrol responded to a disturbance at a residence located in the 4700 block of 212<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Investigation revealed several subjects arguing in a residence, however when contacted they refused to cooperate.
- On January 29, patrol responded to a harassment complaint in the 22800 block of Lakeview Drive. The reporting person stated that when he confronted suspicious subjects in the parking lot, an unidentified male threatened him with a knife. The suspect was not located.
- On January 29, patrol responded to a domestic assault at a residence located in the 21800 block of 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. Investigation revealed the residents, who are married, began arguing about something and the male suspect assaulted the victim. He was arrested for the offense and booked at the Snohomish County Jail without incident.
- On January 29, patrol contacted two subjects in Veterans Park, which was closed due to hazardous conditions involving garbage left in the park. Both were cited for the violation and released.
- On January 30, patrol responded to a theft-from-vehicle report at a residence located in the 5100 block of 230<sup>th</sup> Street SW. The victim reported unknown suspect(s) broke into his vehicle overnight and stole miscellaneous property.

The resident stated he was suicidal and that he had ingested a large amount of prescription medication. He was taken into protective custody and transported to the hospital by aid personnel.



- On January 30, patrol responded to a suspicious circumstance at Veterans Park, which involved a device that was made to look like a pipe bomb. The Washington State Patrol Bomb Squad responded to investigate. The device was deemed to be inert and recovered as evidence. Investigation continues.
- On January 30, patrol responded to a theft report at a residence located in the 5900 block of 214<sup>th</sup> Street SW. The victim reported a package containing a computer was stolen from her doorstep by unknown suspect(s).

The resident stated he was suicidal and destructive due to separation from his girlfriend. He was taken into protective custody and transported to the hospital for an evaluation.

- On February 1, patrol contacted a suspicious vehicle located in the 4300 block of 212<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Investigation revealed the occupant to have multiple warrants for his arrest. A search of the vehicle revealed him to also be in possession of drug paraphernalia and heroin. Custody was transferred to the Bothell Police Department. Charges pending further investigation.
- On February 1, patrol stopped a vehicle in the 6000 block of 220<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Investigation revealed the driver to have a revoked license. He was arrested and booked at the Snohomish County Jail without incident.
- On February 1, patrol responded to a disturbance in the 4700 block of 212<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Investigation revealed management was trying to evict a hostile tenant who was threatening personnel. Patrol stood by while the property manager gathered items from the office and left due to fear of reprisal.
- On February 1, patrol responded to a behavioral health report in the 24400 block of 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. Upon arrival patrol contacted an individual who was clearly unable to care for himself. He was taken into protective custody and transported to the hospital for an evaluation.
- On February 1, patrol responded to a theft-from-vehicle report at a residence located in the 4100 block of 236<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Investigation revealed the victim's license plates were stolen and replaced by plates previously reported as stolen out of Kirkland. There is no suspect information.



- On February 2, patrol responded to a domestic disturbance at a residence located in the 5100 block of 230<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Investigation revealed the residents to be married and arguing about various issues. The suspect threw food at the victim during the altercation. The suspect was arrested for the offense and released to hospital staff due to a number of health issues.
- On February 2, patrol responded to a malicious mischief report at Evergreen Playfields. Unknown suspect(s) damaged the property by spray painting graffiti on structures at the park.

### **Code Enforcement Property of the Week**

On January 20 Code Enforcement was dispatched to an abandoned vehicle complaint involving a light blue Chrysler Concord, parked on the public right of way for over two months without being moved. The vehicle was located at the 21900 block of 53<sup>rd</sup> Avenue W.

When Code Enforcement arrived they observed the vehicle apparently stored on the public right-of-way. A check of the vehicle indicated it had not been reported stolen. Code Enforcement chalked the rear driver's side tire, and issued a correction notice.

On January 27, Code Enforcement returned to the location, and noted the vehicle had not moved and the previously issued correction notice was still located on the vehicle's windshield. Towing was dispatched and the vehicle was impounded.
