CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to further support social distancing and limitations on public gatherings, Governor Inslee issued [Proclamation 20-28](#) to temporarily address requirements of the state's Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) that require a physical location for the public to observe government meetings. This proclamation continues to be extended during the pandemic, and as a result City Council meetings are required to be held over the telephone or internet and the public must be able to hear the meeting live via telephone.

The City Council's next regular meeting is on **Monday, April 19** beginning at 7:00 p.m. via telephone and internet ([Meeting ID: 860 0350 5822 | Passcode: 041921](#)). The agenda includes: (1) Adoption of Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 2785 To Extend New City Hall Address Effective Date and Mountlake Terrace Municipal Code Section 2.10.120.D Regarding Public Information Center; (2) Approval of Amendment 1 for Recreation Conservation Office Funding of Evergreen Playfield #1; and (3) Park Master Plan Updates.

The City Council's next work/study session is on **Thursday, April 29** beginning at 7:00 p.m. via telephone and internet ([Meeting ID: 844 3404 4908 | Passcode: 042521](#)). The agenda includes: (1) Introduction of Request for Town Center Zoning Text Amendment – Corner Commercial; (2) Review of 2021 First Quarter Police Department Report; (3) Discussion of 2021 Tour de Terrace; and (4) Discussion of 3rd of July Event.

- **Online Open House:** The Recreation & Parks Department wants your input on two master plans: the Recreation, Parks and Open Space Master Plan (RPOS) and Veterans Memorial Park Master Plan.

CITY CLERK AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS

- **Mountlake Terrace Recruiting for Boards and Commissions:** The city is seeking candidates to serve on its boards and commissions. The city recruits annually to have applications on file for when periodic openings occur, and currently there is an opening on the Arts Advisory



Commission. Most city boards and commissions have three-year terms that expire on June 30, with the exception of the Planning Commission, which has terms of four years.

The city has four regular boards and commissions that includes the Arts Advisory Commission; Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Commission (DEIC); Planning Commission; and the Recreation and Parks Advisory Commission (RPAC). Additionally, the city has two Commissions that meet less frequently including the Civil Service Commission (meets as needed – typically 1-3 times per year) and the City Council Salary Commission (meets every three years).

In most cases, board and commission members do not need specialized training or experience. Members find volunteering fun and rewarding by meeting people with similar interests, learning about the city, and helping shape the future of Mountlake Terrace. We seek volunteers who represent the diverse community, and welcome all applicants.

- **Summer Events:** The city is meeting with the sponsors of the July 3 Fireworks event and Tour de Terrace to discuss partnership agreements with each group if events are able to occur under pandemic guidelines. Each organization is making plans to move forward, however they will need to meet the state's COVID-19 requirements for fairs and special events that are currently in draft form.
- **COVID-19 Vaccine:** The Washington State Department of Health launched a [web tool](#) to help you find a vaccination appointment by entering your zip code. The tool looks at various scheduling options from multiple providers to find a vaccination appointment easier and is available in multiple languages (see upper right corner to change to another language besides English). - **Evictions Moratorium and Ban on Utility Shutoffs Extended:** In March, the Governor issued a [Proclamation](#) extending Washington State's moratorium on evictions through June 30, 2021. The moratorium is intended to protect tenants who have fallen behind on their rent because of the economic downturn that arrived with the COVID-19

pandemic. Additionally, the Governor [extended provisions](#) to ban shutting off utility services to those behind on their payments through July 31, 2021.

- **COVID-19 Case Rates:** Each week, Snohomish County’s COVID-19 case counts graphic is updated and posted on the [city’s website](#). According to Snohomish Health District and other public health agencies, the case counts are rising again and although people are getting vaccinated, it is still very important to continue to wear masks, avoid large gatherings, physically distance, and wash your hands until the virus is under control.
- **City Low-Income Utility Discount Applications Due April 30:** Applications are available for Mountlake Terrace utility customers who reside in the city and meet adopted income levels for the May 1, 2021 to April 30, 2022 Utility Billing Discount Program period. *(Customers can apply any time, but income information is determined based on income tax statements typically due by April 15.)*

The City Council recently amended the income thresholds to align them with the state’s levels that determine low-income property tax exemptions under RCW 84.36.383. Mountlake Terrace Municipal Code Chapter 13.05.375 states that Mountlake Terrace property owners over the age of 62 living on the property in a household with an aggregate income as shown in the table are eligible to qualify for a 30 percent discount on water, sewer, and stormwater charges. This discount also applies to Mountlake Terrace low-income property owners who have a disabled family member living with them. Residents who meet low-income thresholds may qualify for free garbage pick-up as well.

Or, contact the Utility Billing Department at utilitybilling@mltwa.gov or call 425-744-6214 and ask for an application to be mailed to you. Applications were mailed this week to existing customers who are currently enrolled in the program. Applications from new or existing customers must be received by the city by **April 30, 2021**. As the city will be moving from the Interim to the new City Hall, please return applications to PO BOX 72, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043. In addition to the application, residents must submit proof of income. Please ensure your application is complete as we cannot approve incomplete applications. - **Puget Sound Energy (PSE) Natural Gas Main Relocation Project:** In conjunction with the city's Westside Water Main Project, PSE has begun work on the relocation of a gas main. The water and gas projects are coordinated together so new pavement does not have to be disturbed a second time. According to PSE, work will be done between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. - **Public Access to City Facilities:** During Governor Inslee's Coronavirus orders, Interim City Hall, the Police Station and the Public Works Shop are closed to the public. The city will continue to process building and development permits, inspect essential construction activities, provide police services and maintain grounds and infrastructure.

Effective March 8, the Recreation Pavilion hours are Monday through Thursday, 5:45 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Friday 5:45 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. with reservations necessary for all programs. The facility is not open on the weekend. Please email mltrecreation@mltwa.gov or call 425-776-9173 Monday-Friday to register or get more information about our programs.

Athletic fields opened March 1 by reservation only and with appropriate safety plans. Park trails, the boat launch, fishing pier, off-leash dog park, tennis courts and basketball court are open, subject to gathering and social distancing requirements. PUBLIC WORKS/ENGINEERING SERVICES

- **Natural Yard Care Webinar:** The city sponsored a [free natural yard care webinar](#) provided by Snohomish Conservation District on April 14. The webinar covered ways to reduce impacts to the environment from yard care, provided gardening ideas for this spring and summer, and ideas for how to make your yard beautiful without resorting to chemicals or increasing your water bill. Unique, beautiful landscaping can be low maintenance and can reduce stormwater runoff, keeping lakes and streams clean.

- **Application Process:** Until further notice, City Hall will remain closed to the public. All [permit applications](#) are accepted at this time through a ‘no-contact’ procedure. Note: Permit processing times have increased to 4-6 weeks due to compliance with COVID-19 mandates. Call 425-775-9694 to schedule an inspection and have your permit number and address ready. Your project must have issued permits on-site, require workers to be six-feet apart, and have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan (Washington State Department of Labor & Industries will enforce requirements for contractors to comply). FINANCE

- **Utility Billing Bill Processing, Online Account Management and Payment Services:** A Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued for a Vendor/Contractor that can provide the city with utility bill printing/mailing, payment processing/lock box services, and online bill pay, plus email, text and phone call notifications and payment processing. Submittals are due April 30 at 4:00pm to Crystil Wooldridge at cwooldridge@mltwa.gov. View the complete [RFP package online](#).
- **City Utility Billing Payment Update:** In response to a cyberattack on a vendor the city uses to process utility payments (AFTS), the city is using a different online payment option that is now live on the city’s website. A link to the CardPoint payment service option is [now available](#). Customers will need their account information available as this new vendor is merely an online payment portal and does not have your utility account information to view.

The city has three ways you can pay: (1) Mail to PO Box 72, Mountlake Terrace, 98043; (2) Submit payment in the payment drop box outside of Interim City Hall at 6100 219th Street SW; or (3) Utilize the [online payment option](#) the city has secured with another of our vendors, CardConnect. **If you already use bill pay with your bank, please confirm the mailing address is PO Box 72, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043.**

Our utility bills look a little different right now because the city is processing them in-house instead of through the vendor (see sample bill). We ask you to mail checks to the city, rather than AFTS (which has a Seattle address). These changes are temporary until all services are restored. - **Relief Due to COVID-19 Emergency:** Since March 19, 2020, water service is not being shut off for residential customers' inability to pay during the COVID-19 emergency. The action remains in effect under the state's most recent proclamations addressing the pandemic. No late fees or penalties will apply during this time.

The service fee charged by the vendor for online utility payments has also been suspended for those choosing to pay online. The city recognizes that COVID-19 is a threat to the health of the community, and the ability to frequently wash our hands is paramount in the fight to curb the spread of the virus. As called for by the state and Snohomish Health District, this step will enable the community to ensure proper cleaning measures. We encourage customers to continue to make their payments or to contact Utility Billing at utilitybilling@mltwa.gov or 425-744-6214 or to make payment arrangements, if they are unable to pay at this time.

RECREATION, PARKS & PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

- **Swimming Lessons:** The first session of swimming lessons started this week, with Monday/Wednesday a bit fuller than Tuesday/Thursday. Registration is online only and sessions will run every two weeks. We are offering beginning levels 1-3 in both preschool and school age. The second session and beyond will include parent/tot for children ages six months to three years old and their parent. Registration will be at the end of each session, watch for announcements on Facebook and while at the Recreation Pavilion.
- **Lifeguard Training Class:** A Lifeguard Training Course will be offered through the American Red Cross, using the blended learning format that includes an online lecture and the water skills portion at the Recreation Pavilion on May 8, 15 and 22 from 10:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m., fees are \$186 for residents and \$205 for non-residents. The class will follow current COVID-19 guidelines set up by the American Red Cross and Department of Health, with PPE, rescue manikins and social distancing during class times. Candidates must register in advance to allow enough time to complete the online portion, which is approximately seven hours and it must be done before the first in person session. Candidates must be able to swim 300 yards non-stop, complete a timed event in one minute forty seconds and tread water for two minutes using only their legs. - **Hiring:** Aquatics is hiring part-time Lifeguards and Swim Instructors for now, summer and beyond. To be a Lifeguard, candidates must hold a current Lifeguarding Certification and enjoy working with all ages of people. Swim Instructors are trained in house, these candidates must enjoy the water and working with children. Applications can be [submitted online](#).
- **Dog Obedience:** The first session of Dog Obedience class, in one year, is now finishing. Registration is open for the following Dog Obedience classes: Basic Dog Obedience, July 12-August 23 (May is currently full); Beyond Basic Dog Obedience, May 5-June 2 and July 14-August 11; and Puppygarten, May 6-June 10 and July 15-August 19. Registration is [available online](#) or by calling the Recreation Pavilion at 425-776-9173. Classes are limited in size to allow for physical distancing.
- **WellCity Program:** Recreation Supervisor Rose Ploeg is participating in the Virtual Healthy Worksite Summit on April 14 and 15, sponsored by Association of Washington Cities. This conference is for organizations that participate in the WellCity program and provides sessions that help organizations promote and offer programs for employee wellness. The city will also be recognized for being a WellCity.

- **Police Visit:** On March 12, Officer O'Hagan visited the Kindergarten Readiness and Jr. Kids Krew classrooms to speak with the kids about safety, stranger danger and leaving their homes unattended. He will be returning on April 22 and May 5 to speak with the Tuesday/Thursday preschool and school age children as well.
- **Summer Camp 2021:** Registration has opened for youth day camps. Summer camps will include fun games, activities and potential fieldtrips. For more information email childcare@mltwa.gov or register [online](#).
- **Fall Pre-Registration 2021:** Pre-registration has opened for fall childcare. These before and after-school programs, as well as preschool classes, will begin in September for the new school year. To reserve your spot email childcare@mltwa.gov.
- **Evergreen Playfield:** The Evergreen Playfield turf renovation project is moving quickly. The contractor, Fieldturf, has been continuing construction of the new synthetic turf field to replace the existing sand field at the Evergreen Playfield Complex Field #1. They completed leveling and paving work and are preparing it for the new turf. The synthetic turf will be delivered on April 19 and as a result the Evergreen Play Area will be closed for the next few weeks. Field construction should be completed by mid to late spring.

- **Maintenance Aide Position:** The Parks Department is hiring a Maintenance Aide position. This position carries out assigned park and/or building maintenance tasks within the Recreation and Park Department. Applications can be [submitted online](#).
- **Earth Day/Arbor Day:** In honor of Earth Day and Arbor Day, the city invites residents to join the Mountlake Terrace Volunteer Park Cleanup on Saturday, April 24, from 9:00 a.m. to about noon. The work party will be held at Ballinger Park and if enough volunteers attend, some may be sent to work at Veterans Memorial Park. POLICE DEPARTMENT

- **Police Lobby Closed for Construction:** The lobby remains closed for all in-person business due to construction of the Police Station expansion/Civic Campus Redevelopment Project. Impacted services include in-person payments, fingerprinting services, and license renewals.

The public can conduct most business with the Police Department over the telephone, fax, or email as well as mail; however, fingerprinting services are suspended until further notice. Weekly Patrol Synopsis

- This week included two verbal domestic arguments, five vehicle prowls and two warrant arrests.
- On April 7, officers responded to the 21700 block of 66th Avenue W for a report of a prowler. Officers stopped a possible suspect but could not establish probable cause. No crimes were reported in the area.
- On April 7, a credit card was stolen from a mailbox located at the 23400 block of 52nd Avenue W. An unknown subject charged over \$1,500 of merchandise.
- On April 7, two subjects were found camping on private property. The owner of the property requested the subjects be trespassed. Officers served the notices and the subjects left the area.

- On April 7, officers were dispatched to the 4300 block of 212th Street SW for a driver who appeared to be unconscious in a vehicle that was left running. Upon arrival officers found the driver asleep and the vehicle running. In plain view, officers saw pills and evidence of drug use. After the driver was contacted he showed signs of intoxication due to drugs. The driver performed some voluntary field sobriety tests, which he failed. He was booked into Snohomish County Jail for DUI.
- On April 7, a malicious mischief was reported at the 24000 block of Van Ry Boulevard. It appears that an unknown person cut the fencing around the construction area. There are no suspects or leads at this time.
- On April 9, officers responded to a hit-and-run at the 23500 block of 55th Avenue W. It was reported that a white utility van struck a vehicle and fled the area. The suspect vehicle had some distinct markings on it. Further investigation is required.
- On April 9, officers responded to the 23400 block of 50th Avenue W for an assault. Upon arrival officers contacted several subjects who were arguing about a vehicle. One of the subjects had taken an axe and struck the vehicle. None of the parties wanted to pursue charges, and they were all made to go their separate ways.
- On April 9, a catalytic converter was stolen from a vehicle at the 5100 block of 244th. There are no suspects or leads at this time.
- On April 10, several people had mail stolen from their mailboxes at the 4000 block of 229th Place SW.
- On April 11, officers responded to a physical domestic at the 4700 block of 212th Street SW. Upon arrival officers contacted two subjects who had previously been in a dating relationship. The subjects were arguing, with one subject breaking a cell phone and the other subject punching the victim. The assaulter was arrested and booked into jail for assault 4 domestic violence.
- Officers responded to a commercial burglary at the 21200 block of 52nd Avenue W. Upon arrival officers discovered that an unknown subject broke into the business and stole approximately \$500 from the cash register. There are no suspects or leads at this time.
- On April 11, an officer stopped a vehicle because the driver had a felony warrant for his arrest. While talking with the suspect and waiting for backup prior to arrest, the suspect became agitated and attempted to leave. The officer then took control of the suspect and was eventually able to take him into custody. The suspect was booked for a warrant and obstructing a law enforcement officer.
- Officers responded to the 23900 block of 55th Avenue W for a prowler. Officers contacted a subject matching the description and found probable cause for trespassing and vehicle prowling. The suspect was cited and released with a court date.

- On April 12, officers responded to a report of identification theft at the 4400 block of 212th Street SW. The victim had been applying for jobs and learned that one of the jobs she was applying for might have been fraudulent. During the phone interview, the company was requesting money and personal information. The victim did not give any of this information and called the police.
- On April 12, officers responded to the 21700 block of 56th Avenue W for a report of a physical domestic. Upon arrival officers contacted a male and female subject, and it became clear to the officer that an assault had occurred, but both the suspect and victim were not being truthful about what happened. Probable cause was eventually developed for the male suspect. He was arrested and booked into jail for assault 4 DV.

Code Enforcement Property of the Week

Code Enforcement followed up to a property complaint with multiple nuisance violations, occurring near the 4600 block of 220th Street SW. Code Enforcement noted a number of miscellaneous items in the driveway not properly stored and covered by tarps, a utility trailer parked in the front yard, gallon sized containers with unknown contents, window screens not properly installed into windows and left outside in the elements, and trash and debris.

Code Enforcement issued a Civil Notice of Violation in accordance with 8.15.040.K (Machinery and equipment), 8.15.040.E.2 (Toxic or Caustic Substances), 8.15.050.D (All vehicle parts and accessories), and 8.15.050.B.1 (All motor vehicles that are unused for 30 days or more shall be stored inside a fully enclosed structure).

On April 13, Code Enforcement returned to the location and noted the property was in compliance with the City's nuisance ordinances.



Other Items of Interest

Officer Froisland and K-9 Jax assisted Tulalip Police with a drug search. With their assistance, Tulalip Detectives seized 13 grams of cocaine, 4 grams of marijuana, 27.5 Xanax bars, a stolen hand gun, and over \$13,000 in cash.
