CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to further support social distancing and limitations on public gatherings, Governor Inslee issued [Proclamation 20-28](#) to temporarily address requirements of the state's Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) that require a physical location for the public to observe government meetings. This proclamation continues to be extended during the pandemic, and as a result City Council meetings are required to be held over the telephone or internet and the public must be able to hear the meeting live via telephone.

- **Summer Events:** The uncertainty of COVID-19 phases, difficulty to secure insurance and sponsors, and logistics of adhering to Coronavirus protocols have made it difficult to plan for summer events. The city has received a number of inquiries about summer events, so here is an update with the best available information as our local non-profits and the city navigate the guidelines from the State of Washington and Snohomish Health District.
 - **July 3 Fireworks Show:** Cheeseburger Babies Foundation has informed the city that a fireworks show will either be cancelled or shown virtually due to limitations on in-person gatherings. Visit www.cityofmlt.com/2012 for more information closer to the date.
 - **Tour de Terrace Summer Festival:** The Tour de Terrace organization is making an effort to hold a modified event, but they will definitely **not** hold the parade, car show, or fireworks show in 2021. The organization hopes to have music, beer garden, carnival, food, and street fair but plans are on hold until the Governor's phase announcement in late May. Please watch for announcements [online](#). Additionally, should an event take place, Tour de Terrace needs volunteers to monitor entry and exit sites and to count attendees.  - **National Night Out Against Crime:** The city has cancelled this event in 2021 but we look forward to a terrific event in 2022!
 - **Arts of the Terrace Juried Art Show:** Friends of the Arts has also decided to cancel the show this year.

- Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF):** The American Rescue Plan Act established the Restaurant Revitalization Fund to provide funding to help restaurants and other eligible businesses keep their doors open. This program will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$10 million per business and no more than \$5 million per physical location. Recipients are not required to repay the funding as long as funds are used for eligible uses no later than March 11, 2023. **Applications opened on May 3, 2021 and more information can be found in the [SBA application portal](#).**

- COVID-19 Vaccine:** The Washington State Department of Health launched a [web tool](#) to help you find a vaccination appointment by entering your zip code. The tool looks at various scheduling options from multiple providers to find a vaccination appointment easier and is available in multiple languages (see upper right corner to change to another language besides English). On April 15, all Washington residents age 16 and older are eligible for the vaccine.

- **Veterans Memorial Park Online Open House Continues:** The city is working on a master plan for Veterans Memorial Park, 23400 58th Avenue W, to guide decision-making and improvements to the park. We recently asked for feedback on three draft concepts for the park during the online open house for the Recreation, Parks and Open Space Plan update, and the city is seeking additional feedback. - **Evictions Moratorium and Ban on Utility Shutoffs Extended:** In March, the Governor issued a [Proclamation](#) extending Washington State's moratorium on evictions through June 30, 2021. The moratorium is intended to protect tenants who have fallen behind on their rent because of the economic downturn that arrived with the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, the Governor [extended provisions](#) to ban shutting off utility services to those behind on their payments through July 31, 2021.
- **COVID-19 Case Rates:** Each week, Snohomish County's COVID-19 case counts graphic is updated and posted on the [city's website](#). According to Snohomish Health District and other public health agencies, the case counts are rising again and although people are getting vaccinated, it is still very important to continue to wear masks, avoid large gatherings, physically distance, and wash your hands until the virus is under control.
- **Zoom Council Meetings:** The recorded videos of City Council meetings on Zoom are available on the bottom of the City Council's [meeting page](#).
- **Public Access to City Facilities:** During Governor Inslee's Coronavirus orders, Interim City Hall, the Police Station and the Public Works Shop are closed to the public. The city will continue to process building and development permits, inspect essential construction activities, provide police services and maintain grounds and infrastructure.

The Recreation Pavilion hours are Monday through Thursday, 5:45 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Friday 5:45 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. with reservations necessary for all programs. The facility is not open on the weekend. Please email mltrecreation@mltwa.gov or call 425-776-9173 Monday-Friday to register or get more information about our programs.

Athletic fields opened March 1 by reservation only and with appropriate safety plans. Park trails, the boat launch, fishing pier, off-leash dog park, tennis courts and basketball court are open, subject to gathering and social distancing requirements. - **Application Process:** Until further notice, City Hall will remain closed to the public. All [permit applications](#) are accepted at this time through a ‘no-contact’ procedure. Note: Permit processing times have increased to 4-6 weeks due to compliance with COVID-19 mandates. Call 425-775-9694 to schedule an inspection and have your permit number and address ready. Your project must have issued permits on-site, require workers to be six-feet apart, and have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan (Washington State Department of Labor & Industries will enforce requirements for contractors to comply). *The permit intake box is located by the door to City Hall on the second floor. A permit specialist will be in contact with confirmation of receipt and invoice fees due to begin processing.

FINANCE

- **Utility Billing Bill Processing, Online Account Management and Payment Services:** The city received seven Request for Proposals (RFPs) for a vendor/contractor that can provide the city with utility bill printing/mailing, payment processing/lock box services, and online bill pay, plus email, text and phone call notifications and payment processing. Interviews are being scheduled for early next week. The City Council will review and discuss the proposals at the May 13 work/study session, with award of contact anticipated at the May 17 meeting.
- **City Utility Billing Payment Update:** In response to a cyberattack on a vendor the city uses to process utility payments (AFTS), the city is using a different online payment option that is now live on the city’s website. A link to the CardPoint payment service option is [available](#).

Customers will need their account information available as this new vendor is merely an online payment portal and does not have your utility account information to view.

There are three ways to pay: (1) Mail to PO Box 72, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043; (2) Use the payment drop box outside of Interim City Hall at 6100 219th Street SW; or (3) Utilize the [online payment option](#) the city has secured with our vendor CardConnect. **If you already use bill pay with your bank, please confirm the mailing address is PO Box 72, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043.**

Utility bills look a little different because the city is processing them in-house instead of through the vendor (see sample bill). We ask you to mail checks to the city, rather than AFTS (which has a Seattle address). These changes are temporary until all services are restored. - **Relief Due to COVID-19 Emergency:** Since March 19, 2020, water service is not being shut off for residential customers' inability to pay during the COVID-19 emergency. The action remains in effect under the state's most recent proclamations addressing the pandemic. No late fees or penalties will apply during this time.

The service fee charged by the vendor for online utility payments has also been suspended for those choosing to pay online. The city recognizes that COVID-19 is a threat to the health of the community, and the ability to frequently wash our hands is paramount in the fight to curb the spread of the virus. As called for by the state and Snohomish Health District, this step will enable the community to ensure proper cleaning measures. We encourage customers to continue to make their payments or to contact Utility Billing at utilitybilling@mltwa.gov or 425-744-6214 or to make payment arrangements, if they are unable to pay at this time.

RECREATION, PARKS & PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

- **Drowning Prevention Network Meeting:** Recreation Supervisor, Rose Ploeg, took part in a two-day Zoom meeting sponsored by the Drowning Prevention Network which includes Recreation & Park departments, Seattle Children's Hospital, Seattle/King County Health Department and Washington State Parks Boating Education Program, Law Enforcement and Coast Guard representatives. Discussion topics included: how everyone is operating during the pandemic; Lifejacket Loaner Programs; updates on drowning rates and data; and an overview of the US National Water Safety Action Plan.

Weekly Patrol Synopsis
