CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to support social distancing and limitations on public gatherings, Governor Inslee's [Proclamation 20-28](#) temporarily addresses requirements of the state's Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) that requires a physical location for the public to observe government meetings. This proclamation continues to be extended during the pandemic, and as a result City Council meetings are required to be held over the telephone or internet and the public must be able to hear the meeting live via telephone. The City Council's **Thursday, July 1 work/study session is scheduled to be cancelled at the June 21 meeting.**

COMMUNITY MEETINGS AND EVENTS

- **Virtual Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Evergreen #1 Turf Field:** Thanks to the cooperation of numerous funding partners, the city cut the ribbon on the brand new emerald green turf field at Evergreen Playfield Complex located at 22205 56th Avenue W. The ceremony took place on Wednesday, June 9 and the city invites the community to attend the virtual ceremony scheduled next Wednesday, June 23 at 6:30 p.m.

The project was enthusiastically supported by the Verdant Health Commission, which contributed \$1 million in grant funding toward the project from its Building Healthy Communities Fund. Additionally, the city received nearly \$600,000 from the Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO). Snohomish County funding and Terrace Brier Soccer Club donations added over \$200,000 toward the total project cost of nearly \$2.2 million.

Year-round usability was a key benefit of the project, which converted the former dirt field with aging wood light poles to synthetic turf field with new LED lighting. The project also included new fencing, improved pathways, and amenities such as soccer goals and corner flags with bleachers on the way. The new turf field now accommodates soccer, youth baseball and fastpitch, t-ball, and possibly other uses such as ultimate Frisbee.

FieldTurf USA, Inc. constructed the project that commenced in January and wrapped up at the beginning of June.

CITY CLERK AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS

- **City Hall Services Moving:** A postcard was sent to everyone with a 98043 zip code this week to announce that City Hall services are moving on June 19. The postcard also informed the community that departments working in City Hall will not be able to respond to telephone calls and emails on Friday, June 18 and Monday, June 21 as we are packing and unpacking equipment. City Hall services will be back online Tuesday, June 22, however we will not be open yet to the public under COVID guidelines. Stay tuned for updates!
- **Planning Commission Interviews:** The special recruitment for a vacancy on the city's Planning Commission closed on June 11, and interviews will take place on June 29. The City Council is tentatively scheduled to appoint the new member at their July 6 meeting. The Planning Commission reviews and makes recommendations to the City Council on planning policy and certain development permits, and makes recommendations on the city's Comprehensive Plan and development codes.
- **Drive through Vaccination Site Events at High School Cancelled:** Edmonds School District has **cancelled** the vaccination event that was planned for June 27.
- **City Partners on Month-Long Blood Drive:** The city and Bloodworks Northwest have collaborated on a month-long blood drive. Mayor Matsumoto Wright attended a pop-up blood drive on June 4 to encourage Mountlake Terrace residents to lend their support. Due to

COVID-19 distancing requirements, the mobile bus known as the “Bloodmobile” cannot be used at this time. Instead, Bloodworks Northwest is holding their donation events at sites like the Edmonds Waterfront Center, 220 Railroad Avenue in Edmonds. To help this cause, please take these steps:

- **Update on City Summer Events:** The city has met with organizers of the July 3 Family Fireworks event and Tour de Terrace about plans to meet state COVID-19 requirements for events and festivals. Given the short turnaround time following the next announcement by the Governor, and the difficulty in meeting current state guidelines for large outdoor venues, neither event will take place in 2021.

After months of consideration, the key issues are the ability to manage the crowds in the vast areas of Ballinger Park and the Evergreen Playfield Complex with adjacent spaces, as well as procuring the fencing and staffing necessary to meet the requirements including counting guests that enter and exit the venues. Ultimately, given the resources and staffing available, meeting these requirements is not possible.

It was noted during the discussions that several traditional events in the area are not taking place this summer except for those events that charge an entrance fee that helps pay for staffing and equipment needed to provide for enhanced social distancing, sanitation, hygiene, and attendance control. As the July 3 Family Fireworks and Tour de Terrace events are provided free to the public, the funding needed to meet stringent COVID-19 protocols were too much for these volunteer organizations to absorb, particularly in such large venues that do not have natural containment.

“As disappointed as we are to not hold these events in our community, it was just too expensive and expansive to manage this year while maintaining public health and safety,” stated Community Relations Director Virginia Olsen.

Updates on other Mountlake Terrace events:

- National Night Out Against Crime: The city has cancelled this event in 2021 but we look forward to a terrific event in 2022!
 - (Updated May 27) Arts of the Terrace Juried Art Show: Friends of the Arts has decided to make a decision following the Governor’s announcement on June 30.
 - City Hall Grand Opening: Stay tuned as we are making plans for a proper ribbon cutting on our brand new [Civic Campus Renovation Project](#) as the summer progresses.
- **Broadcasting Future Council Meetings:** With recent announcements on the possibility of moving to Phase 4 this summer, cities are working on reopening plans as well as policies and

procedures for hybrid (online and in-person) meetings. The City Clerk has met with Granicus, the city's streaming software provider, and Edmonds College, provider of the local cable Public Education Government (PEG) channel also known as Channel 21. The city will continue to work on a plan for streaming and/or televising future City Council meetings after the city moves into the new City Hall.

- **COVID-19 Vaccine Information:** Department of Health has a [web tool](#) to help you find a vaccination appointment by entering your zip code. - **Evictions Moratorium and Ban on Utility Shutoffs:** In March, the Governor issued a [Proclamation](#) extending Washington State's moratorium on evictions through June 30, 2021. The moratorium is intended to protect tenants who have fallen behind on their rent because of the economic downturn that arrived with the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, the Governor [extended provisions](#) to ban shutting off utility services to those behind on their payments through July 31, 2021.

- **Public Access to City Facilities:** During Governor Inslee's Coronavirus orders, Interim City Hall, the Police Station and the Public Works Shop are closed to the public. The city will continue to process building and development permits, inspect essential construction activities, provide police services and maintain grounds and infrastructure.

The Recreation Pavilion hours are Monday through Thursday, 5:45 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Friday 5:45 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. with reservations necessary for all programs. The facility is not open on the weekend. Please email mltrecreation@mltwa.gov or call 425-776-9173 Monday-Friday to register or get more information about our programs.

Athletic fields are open by reservation only and with appropriate safety plans. Park trails, the boat launch, fishing pier, off-leash dog park, tennis courts and basketball court are open,

Until further notice, City Hall will remain closed to the public. All [permit applications](#) are accepted through a ‘no-contact’ procedure. Note: Permit processing times have increased due to compliance with COVID-19 mandates. Call 425-775-9694 to schedule an inspection and have your permit number and address ready. Your project must have issued permits on-site, require workers to be six-feet apart, and have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan (Washington State Department of Labor & Industries will enforce requirements for contractors to comply). *The permit intake box is located by the door to City Hall on the second floor. A Permit Specialist will be in contact with confirmation of receipt and invoice fees due to begin processing.

FINANCE

- **Utility Billing:** The city received seven proposals for a vendor/contractor to provide utility bill printing/mailing, payment processing/lock box services, and online bill paying, plus

email, text and phone notifications. The City Council will review and discuss the proposals in June following a review of the companies' qualifications.

- **City Utility Billing Payment Update:** In response to a cyberattack on a vendor the city uses to process utility payments (AFTS), the city is using a different online payment option that is now live on the city's website. A link to the CardPoint payment service option is [available](#). Customers will need their account information available as this new vendor is merely an online payment portal and does not have your utility account information to view.

There are three ways to pay: (1) Mail to PO Box 72, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043; (2) Use the payment drop box outside of Interim City Hall at 6100 219th Street SW; or (3) Utilize the [online payment option](#) the city has secured with our vendor CardConnect. If you use bill pay with your bank, please confirm the mailing address is PO Box 72, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043.

Utility Bills are back to their original and familiar format. Outdated payment information has been crossed out until the forms can be fully updated. We ask that payments continue to be mailed to the city using the address listed on the remittance portion of the bill. - **Relief Due to COVID-19 Emergency:** Since March 19, 2020, water service is not being shut off for residential customers' inability to pay during the COVID-19 emergency. The action remains in effect under the state's most recent proclamations addressing the pandemic. No late fees or penalties will apply during this time.

The service fee charged by the vendor for online utility payments has also been suspended for those choosing to pay online. The city recognizes that COVID-19 is a threat to the health of the community, and the ability to frequently wash our hands is paramount in the fight to curb the spread of the virus. As called for by the state and Snohomish Health District, this step will enable the community to ensure proper cleaning measures. We encourage customers to continue to make their payments or to contact Utility Billing at utilitybilling@mltwa.gov or 425-744-6214 or to make payment arrangements, if they are unable to pay at this time.

- **Youth Programs:** The youth programs received a Spring COVID-19 Grant from the Department of Child, Youth and Families for \$ 7,500.00. Funds will support all aspects of the department as the demand for child care grows.
- **Youth Programs:** Child care programs are continuing to help kids stay engaged while having fun in a close community and helping make families schedules workable. Registration for summer and fall child care is currently open. To get started go to www.mltrec.com and click on the child care button.
- **Aquatic Schedule Changing:** The Swimming Pool Schedule will be changing to a summer schedule starting on June 28. Changes include ending reservations and returning to drop in swimming, adding water fitness classes, adjusting times, adding Recreation Swim and Camp Swims in the afternoons, adding daytime daily swim lessons and swim team practices in the mornings and afternoons. Limits will remain for each area of the pool and pool deck until Phase 3 ends. With the potential of mandates being lifted by the state in the coming weeks, the pool will follow Phase 3 guidelines set by DOH until then. Distancing and wearing of masks will also still be required until further notice. The summer schedule will be posted on the Recreation Facebook page and the Recreation webpage the week of June 21.
- **Swimming Lessons:** Summer Swimming lesson registration will begin on Wednesday, June 23. Registration can take place online or in person beginning at 9:00 a.m. If participants hold one of the Verdant Swim Vouchers that were distributed this year by Edmonds School district for 3rd graders, they must be presented in person. Vouchers from 2020 will also be accepted. Lessons will begin on Monday, June 28 and will be offered as follows: Daily lessons will be Monday through Thursday for two weeks, daily lessons will not meet on Fridays. Afternoon classes will meet either on Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday, these classes will run for five weeks (ten lessons).
- **Hiring:** Aquatics is hiring part-time Lifeguards, Swim Instructors for summer and for the fall. For summer there are seasonal openings for an assistant for Aqua Kids Camp. As everything opens up more staff is needed to offer programs and open the facility on weekends. To be a Lifeguard, candidates must hold a current Lifeguarding Certification and enjoy working with all ages of people. Swim Instructors are trained in house, these

candidates must enjoy the water and working with children. Applications can be [submitted online](#).

- **Facilities:** The facilities staff have been working at the interim city hall and the new city hall locations to prepare for the move to the new Civic Campus. Staff is ensuring that items at the interim building are ready to move and that the new city hall building is ready for the transfer.
- **Maintenance Aide Position:** The Parks Department is hiring a Maintenance Aide position. This position carries out assigned park and/or building maintenance tasks within the Recreation and Park Department. Applications can be [submitted online](#).
- **Volunteer Event:** A group of volunteers did a volunteer effort at Veterans Memorial Park on Saturday, June 12. The effort was spearheaded by members of the Recreation and Park Advisory Commission and the Mountlake Terrace Community Foundation. 35-40 people attended and concentrated on invasive species removal and ivy control. About 20 yards of debris was removed from the park as well as a full dump truck load of garbage.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The lobby remains closed due to construction of the Police Station expansion/Civic Campus Redevelopment Project. Impacted services include in-person payments and license renewals. As of May 19, fingerprinting services resumed and are available by appointment only; the city is unable to accommodate walk-ins at this time.

The public can conduct most business with the Police Department over the telephone, fax, or email as well as mail. In the meantime, if you have an emergency, please call 911. Weekly Patrol Synopsis

- There were two verbal domestic arguments this week: 6500 block of 224th Street SW and 6100 block of St. Albion Way.
- There were three vehicle prowls this week: 6100 block of St. Albion Way, 4600 block of 223rd Street SW, and 21700 block of Highway 99.
- Officers responded to the 4100 block of 212th Street SW for a report of a Malicious Mischief and a shoplift complaint. Upon arrival the suspect was not located. Further investigation

revealed a suspect identification and evidence of the crime was located. The case is still under investigation.

- During a routine registered sex offender check, officers learned that a registered sex offender had moved out of his residence and had failed notify police. This case is under investigation.
- Officers responded to the 4700 block of 212th Street SW for a report of a domestic assault. Upon arrival the female victim reported that her boyfriend assaulted her by pushing her to the ground. The victim also stated that her boyfriend threatened her, and had damaged her cell phone and several other items throughout her apartment. The suspect was contacted on the telephone and questioned about the incident. The suspect denied all accusations. Probable cause was established and the suspect was cited through the prosecutor.
- Officers responded to the 23200 block of 48th Avenue W for a report of screaming and two gunshots. Multiple units responded, which included the use of an aerial drone. Nothing was located.
- On June 10, a bicycle was stolen from the 4300 block of 236th Street SW. There are no suspects or leads at this time.
- On June 11, officers responded to the 6300 block of St. Albion Way for a civil complaint. The complaint was regarding subjects who were smoking within 25 feet of a public entrance.
- On June 11, officers found probable cause to arrest a female suspect for violating a domestic violence protection order. After being placed under arrest, the female became irate and began kicking at the patrol car door and screaming at the officer during transport to the jail.
- On June 11, officers located an occupied stolen vehicle at the 21900 block of Highway 99. Officers stopped the vehicle and placed the driver under arrest. A search incident to arrest revealed several pieces of drug paraphernalia along with tools to start the vehicle without using keys. The driver was booked into jail and the vehicle was returned to its owner.
- On June 12, officers responded to Ace Hardware for a theft complaint. A male subject walked up to the front counter with several tools, asked a question and then ran out of the store without paying. Case is under investigation.
- On June 12, officers transported an intoxicated male subject to Swedish Edmonds for a mental health evaluation. The subject made several statement about taking his own life.
- On June 13, officers were flagged down and made aware of a potential domestic violence assault that had just occurred. The witness described the assault to officers and confirmed they saw physical injuries on the victim. Officers we unable to locate the victim, however officers did locate the suspect, who admitted to the assault. The suspect was arrested and booked into jail.
- On June 13, Safeway employees reported a theft that had just occurred. Upon arrival, officers were unable to locate the suspect. Evidence was obtained and the case is under investigation.

- On June 13, officers responded to the 4300 block of 236th for a report of a physical domestic. Upon arrival officers contacted the suspect and victim. The argument started over the victim going through the suspect's phone without his permission. The suspect became angry over this, and began breaking the victim's property. Although no assault had occurred, the suspect was arrested for domestic violence malicious mischief and booked into jail.
- On June 16, officers responded to the 23500 block of 65th Place SW for a death investigation. Officers found an elderly man deceased in his bed. The decedent appeared to have died from several long-term medical conditions. Nothing suspicious was noted.

(MTMC 8.15.040.B: Buildings, structures, fences or other constructed objects that are decayed, damaged, or in disrepair to the extent that they pose a threat of collapse, structural failure, or falling onto public property or public right-of-way). The property owner agreed to replace the fence, and in early May, Code Enforcement verified the entire fence line was removed and completely replaced.
