In order to support social distancing and limitations on public gatherings, Governor Inslee's [Proclamation 20-28](#) continues to address the city's responsibilities under the Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) for the public to observe government meetings during the pandemic. - **Small Business Flex Fund Loans:** On June 30, a program was launched for small business owners and nonprofits



across Washington to apply for low interest loans of up to \$150,000 supported by the Washington State Department of Commerce. The Fund is a public-private partnership aimed at helping small businesses and nonprofits (particularly those in low-income communities) recover and grow as communities across the state reopen for business. - **Update on City Summer Events:** The city has met with organizers of Tour de Terrace about plans to meet state COVID-19 requirements for events and festivals. Given the short turnaround time following the Governor's re-opening announcement, and the difficulty in meeting state guidelines for large outdoor venues, the event will not take place in 2021.

- National Night Out Against Crime: The city has cancelled this event in 2021 but we look forward to a terrific event in 2022!
 - City Hall Grand Opening: Stay tuned as we are making plans for a proper ribbon cutting on our brand new [Civic Campus Renovation Project](#) as the summer progresses.
- **Broadcasting Future Council Meetings:** With recent announcements, cities are working on reopening plans as well as policies and procedures for hybrid (online and in-person) meetings. The City Clerk has met with Granicus, the city's streaming software provider, and Edmonds College, provider of the local cable Public Education Government (PEG) channel also known as Channel 21. The city will continue to work on a plan for streaming future City Council meetings.
 - **Vaccine Information:** Department of Health has a [web tool](#) to help you find a vaccination appointment by entering your zip code. It looks at various scheduling options from multiple providers to find an appointment easier and is available in multiple languages (see upper right corner to change to another language besides English).  - **Evictions Moratorium and Ban on Utility Shutoffs:** In March, the Governor issued a [Proclamation](#) extending Washington State's moratorium on evictions through September 30, 2021. The moratorium is intended to protect tenants who have fallen behind on their rent because of the economic downturn that arrived with the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, the Governor [extended provisions](#) to ban shutting off utility services to those behind on their

payments through September 30. View the Governor's latest utility moratorium extension [online](#).

- **Public Access to City Facilities:** Following Governor Inslee's announcement in late June to broaden activities during the pandemic, staff are working on a policy to return to in-person services at City Hall, the Police Station and the Public Works Shop. Until that time, the city will continue to process building and development permits, inspect essential construction activities, provide police services and maintain grounds and infrastructure.

The Recreation Pavilion hours are Monday-Thursday, 5:45 a.m.-8:30 p.m. and Friday 5:45 a.m.-6:30 p.m. The facility is not open on the weekend. Email mltrecreation@mltwa.gov or call 425-776-9173 to register or get more information about our programs.

Athletic fields are open by reservation only and with appropriate safety plans. Park trails, off-leash dog park, tennis courts and basketball court are open.

Until the city re-opens for in-person services, all [permit applications](#) are accepted through a 'no-contact' procedure. Note: Permit processing times have increased due to compliance with COVID-19 mandates. Call 425-775-9694 to schedule an inspection and have your permit number and address ready. Your project must have issued permits on-site, require workers to be six-feet apart, and have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan (Washington State Department of Labor & Industries will enforce requirements for contractors to comply). FINANCE

- **New Utility Billing Vendor Selected:** At the June 21 City Council meeting, the Council approved a contract with Output Services Group, Inc. (OSG) for utility billing services.

In response to input from the community, the new contract will include additional services not previously offered by the city’s vendor (AFTS). OSG services include text, email and phone notification of new bills, late notices, and payments; auto pay; pay as a guest option; and better tracking of when the statements are mailed by OSG and returned to the payment processing center.

OSG is also establishing payment sites with stores like CVS and 7-Eleven so that customers can make payments when it is most convenient for them. Also, the \$2.00 fee for credit card payments that was in the prior contract will not continue in the contract with OSG. The new contract is approximately \$30,000 less per year than.

Also with regard to utility bill payments, since moving into the new City Hall, a payment drop box has been installed near the front entrance located at 23204 58th Avenue W (see photo). Customers may walk or drive up to the drop box.

- **Relief Due to COVID-19 Emergency:** Since March 19, 2020, water service is not being shut off for residential customers' inability to pay during the COVID-19 emergency. The action remains in effect under the state's most recent proclamations addressing the pandemic. No late fees or penalties will apply during this time.

The service fee charged by the vendor for online utility payments has also been suspended for those choosing to pay online. The city recognizes that COVID-19 is a threat to the health of the community, and the ability to frequently wash our hands is paramount in the fight to curb the spread of the virus. As called for by the state and Snohomish Health District, this step will enable the community to ensure proper cleaning measures. - **Dog Training Classes:** The summer session of [Dog Obedience classes](#) will begin the week of July 12. The current schedule is as follows: Basic Dog Obedience meets Monday nights from 7:30-8:30 p.m., July 12-August 23 (this class is full); Beyond Basic Dog Obedience class meets Wednesdays from 7:30-8:30 p.m., beginning August 11. - **Ballinger Park Water Elements Project:** The water elements project has begun at the Ballinger Park Boat Launch. The project includes a new fishing pier, floating boat dock and boat ramp. The Boat Launch area will be closed during construction in July and August, which is when federal and state agencies allow in-water work to be done with the least harm to downstream salmon (referred to the “fish window”). Upland work will conclude in September.
- **Aqua Kids Camp:** Registration for Aqua Kids Camp is filled up for this year. This camp is for kids ages 4-8 who enjoy the water. The camp meets in the Jungle room and the leisure pool Monday-Friday due to construction at Lake Ballinger. - **Lifeguard Training:** The pool closed at 4:30 on Friday July 9 for Lifeguard in-service. This in-service focused on water rescue skills and practicing drills.
- **Marlins Swim Team:** Marlins started their practices on June 28, they will have their first meet on July 11 at the Lynnwood Pool, with warm ups begin at 3:30 p.m. and the meet at 4:00 p.m. The Marlins meet from June 28 through August 12 and will swim against other teams in the area, including Lynnwood and Snohomish Aquatic Center. Our Coaches are all new to the city, however the three assistant coaches, Maddie, Hannah and Kayla, came up through the Mountlake Terrace Swim Program and have previously swam for the Marlins. Our Head Coach Richard, was an assistant coach previously at Shoreline Pool and has been with the city since 2015, currently he is a Fulltime Head Lifeguard Swim Instructor.

- **Swimming Lessons:** A new session of daily [swimming lessons](#) starts July 12 and will run until July 22. Registration for aquatic classes will remain open through the third lesson for anyone who wants to sign up for open spots. If parents are unsure what class children should register for, contact the Aquatic Coordinator at 425.776.9173, ext. 1120, for available placement evaluations in the pool, participants must come prepared to get into the pool. The weekday swim lesson classes are in their third week, Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday lessons will conclude on July 28 and 29. - **Vouchers for Free Swim Lessons for Third Graders and Non-Swimmers:** If you have a 3rd grader who either resides or goes to school within the boundaries of the Edmonds School District, vouchers were distributed at the end of school to use for the rest of the year. Weekly Patrol Synopsis

- There were eight verbal domestic arguments this week: 6000 block of St. Albion Way; 4000 block of 212th Street SW (four occurred at this location); 24200 block of 48th Avenue W; 22600 block of 73rd Place W; and 23600 block of 58th Avenue W.
- There were eight warrant arrests this week: 5900 block of 232nd Street SW; 23500 block of 58th Avenue W; 24300 block of 56th Avenue W; 7000 block of 226th Street SW; 5900 block of 232nd Street SW; 21100 block of 44th Avenue W; 21200 block of 66th Avenue W; and 24000 block of Van Ry Boulevard.
- Police investigated an assault that occurred at the 4500 block of 224th Place SW. It was reported that several subjects were arguing about how many people were living at the residence. A physical fight broke out between two females. Upon arrival the suspect fled the area and was not located. Probable cause was developed and a citation for assault was sent through the prosecutor.
- On July 2, a catalytic converter was stolen from a vehicle at the 4400 block of 222nd Street SW. No suspects or leads at this time.
- On July 2, Medic 18 found a young child with special needs at the 5700 block of 213th without adult supervision. Patrol responded and assisted Medic 18 with returning the child to his mother.
- On July 2, officers were dispatched to another catalytic converter theft. On this case there were witnesses and possible video of the suspect. This case is still under investigation.
- On July 3, while investigating a narcotics complaint, a suspect vehicle drove recklessly to avoid contact from the police. The suspect vehicle almost struck the officer as it was leaving. The officer developed probable cause to arrest the driver for reckless driving. It was later determined that it was an unreported stolen vehicle.
- On July 3, officers responded to a hit-and-run at the 4700 block of 228th Street SW. The suspect fled on foot. Officers were initially unable to find the registered owner of the suspect vehicle. Later, officers contacted the suspect who denied any involvement. Officers developed probable cause and cited the suspect through the prosecutor.

- On July 3, another catalytic converter was stolen from the 21300 block of 52nd Avenue W. No suspects or leads.
- On July 4, officers assisted Seattle police with a stolen bike recovery. Mountlake Terrace officers responded to a possible location of the stolen bike and saw a subject riding around on one that matched the description. Officers developed probable cause and arrested the rider for possession of stolen property. The bike was valued at about \$2,000.
- On July 5, two catalytic converters were stolen from the 7000 block of 220th Street SW. There is video of the thefts. This case is still under investigation.
- On July 6, three catalytic converters were stolen from the 7100 block of 220th Street SW. case is under investigation.

Community Outreach & Directed Enforcement

- Officers Shin and Look conducted a business check at Studio 6 and contacted several subjects on the property.
- Foot patrol on 236th, I-5, behind Cinebarre, and the 21400 block of Interurban Trail. No new camps were located.
- Foot patrol at the 24200 block of Van Ry Boulevard. No camps were located. Sergeant Pickard did locate a Studio 6 resident who was picking up trash in the streambed, and thanked her for her willingness to pick up trash and gave her money for coffee.
- Officer Elrod talked with several people who were enjoying the Lake Ballinger.
- On the morning of July 1, Officer T. Sheets was summoned to an apartment after the Fire Department was unable to rescue a cat stuck behind a water heater. Officer Sheets utilized animal control tools and successfully rescued JoJo the cat (see the photo to the right).



Significant Incidents

- A 26-year-old male died under unusual circumstances in his apartment that is shared with his parents. Detectives and the Medical Examiner's office assisted with the investigation, which is ongoing.

- Patrol responded to a burglary in progress at a marijuana dispensary. The business owner was observing, via remote video, a group of subjects loading product into a vehicle. Upon arrival the vehicle had already left the scene. A K-9 was utilized to assist with the search of the interior of the building, finding no suspects. Investigation is ongoing.
- Patrol responded to a collision involving a vehicle driving into a fence, and the car catching fire. Patrol units were first on scene and attempted to extinguish the fire with fire extinguishers, but were unable to do so. The Fire Department arrived and extinguished the fire. There were no injuries.
- A male suspect was taken into custody following a crime spree that began with the stealing of a vehicle in Snohomish County and wrecking it at the 21600 block of 56th Avenue W. The suspect left the car, and then went to the Capri Apartments and committed a motor vehicle prowl, tried to punch out a vehicle window in the complex, then fled over a fence to the west of the complex and burglarized a residence at the 21400 block of 54th Place W. The suspect then fled to Maple Glen and committed another motor vehicle prowl and trespass into an open garage. He was taken into custody in the complex by Mountlake Terrace and Snohomish County units.
- A 25-year-old female was stabbed at an unknown location in Mountlake Terrace, and dropped off at Swedish Hospital in Edmonds by two males who then left. The victim was uncooperative and only stated that she was stabbed by another female who came into her place. Further investigation revealed the victim had lied about her name, and she refused to cooperate with the investigation. Police went to her her apartment for follow-up and a male was contacted inside. A safety sweep was made for any other victims, with negative results. Patrol units were not able to verify that apartment as the crime scene.
- A male arrived at Swedish Hospital in Edmonds with a gunshot wound to the lower calf. He would not state where the incident occurred or or who shot him. The man provided his address in Mountlake Terrace and in Auburn, and both locations were checked for victims or additional information, with negative results.

Code Enforcement Property of the Week

Code Enforcement observed multiple vehicles parked illegally in marked ADA parking spaces and ADA aisles, located near the 6000 block of St. Albion Way. Code Enforcement issued multiple civil parking infractions to these vehicles in accordance with: MTMC 10.10.060.A (No person shall park a vehicle in a space provided and legally marked for disabled persons on private or publicly owned property, without displaying a special license plate, decal or placard), and 10.10.060.B (No person shall park or make inaccessible the aisle located next to a space reserved for persons with physical disabilities). Code Enforcement will continue to monitor these spaces throughout the city.
