CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to limit the spread of COVID-19, the city continues to follow Governor Inslee's [Proclamation 20-28](#) by holding City Council meetings virtually (online) via Zoom.

COMMUNITY MEETINGS AND EVENTS

- **South County Walks:** The Verdant Health Commission (Snohomish County Public Hospital District #2) is partnering with cities in south Snohomish County to promote good health and fitness through a series of free community walks called "South County Walks." The walks, led by Verdant volunteers, began July 12 and will continue through September 2. Walks are typically two to three miles in length and take about an hour to complete. People of all ages and abilities are encouraged to attend and they are family-friendly!

Mountlake Terrace walks are on Wednesdays through September 1, at 9:30 a.m. at the Recreation Pavilion, 5303 228th Street SW. Edmonds walks are on Tuesdays through August 31, at 9:30 a.m. at the Edmonds Waterfront Center, 220 Railroad Avenue.

Lynnwood walks take place on Mondays, through August 30, at 6:00 p.m. at the Verdant Community Wellness Center, 4710 196th Street SW and/or Thursdays through September 2, at 6:00 p.m. at the Lynnwood Recreation Center, 18900 44th Avenue West.



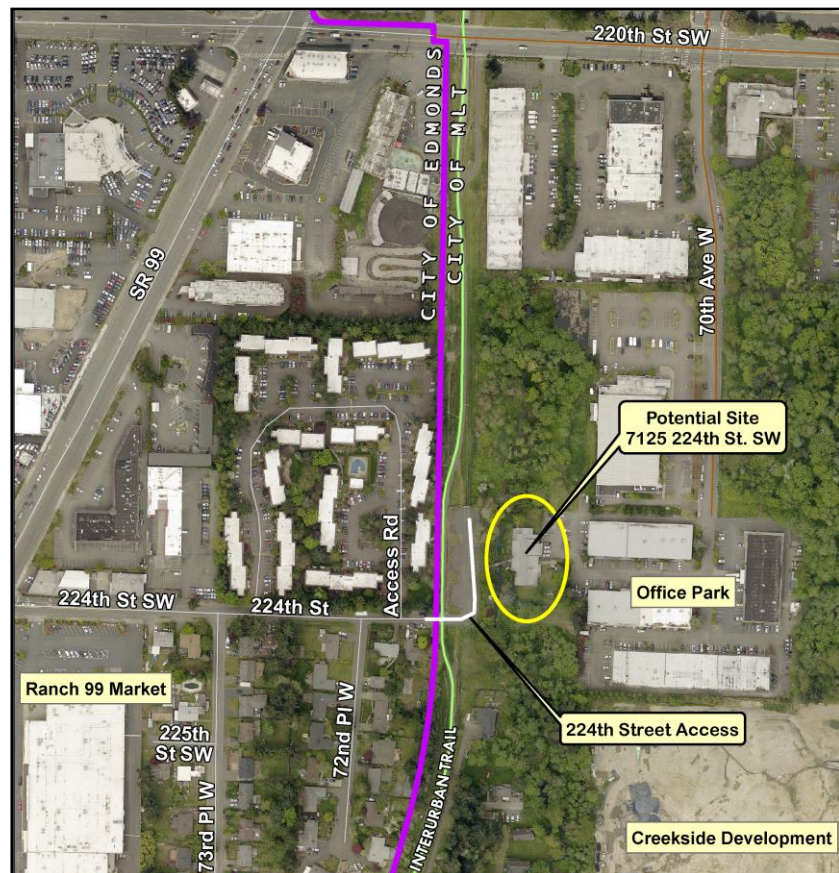

CITY CLERK AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS

- **Site in Mountlake Terrace Examined for Work Release Facility:** *(This item is tentatively scheduled for an update at the August 12 City Council work/study session.)* In 2019 the Legislature directed the Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC) to identify sites for additional work release facilities in various regions of the state, including Snohomish County. The DOC recently identified a commercial property along the Mountlake Terrace/Edmonds border as a leading site for such a facility. The site is located at 7125 224th Street SW along the Interurban Trail on a dead end street with vehicular access from 224th Street in Edmonds near Ranch 99 Market (see map).

State law requires cities to accommodate "essential public facilities," such as work release facilities, and Mountlake Terrace allows this type of facility, with conditions, in the Light Industrial/Office Park zone.



Although DOC stressed in a meeting this week that no decisions have been made, and a public process with stakeholder engagement will continue, DOC's next steps would be to meet with the city's Community and Economic Development Department to discuss the site

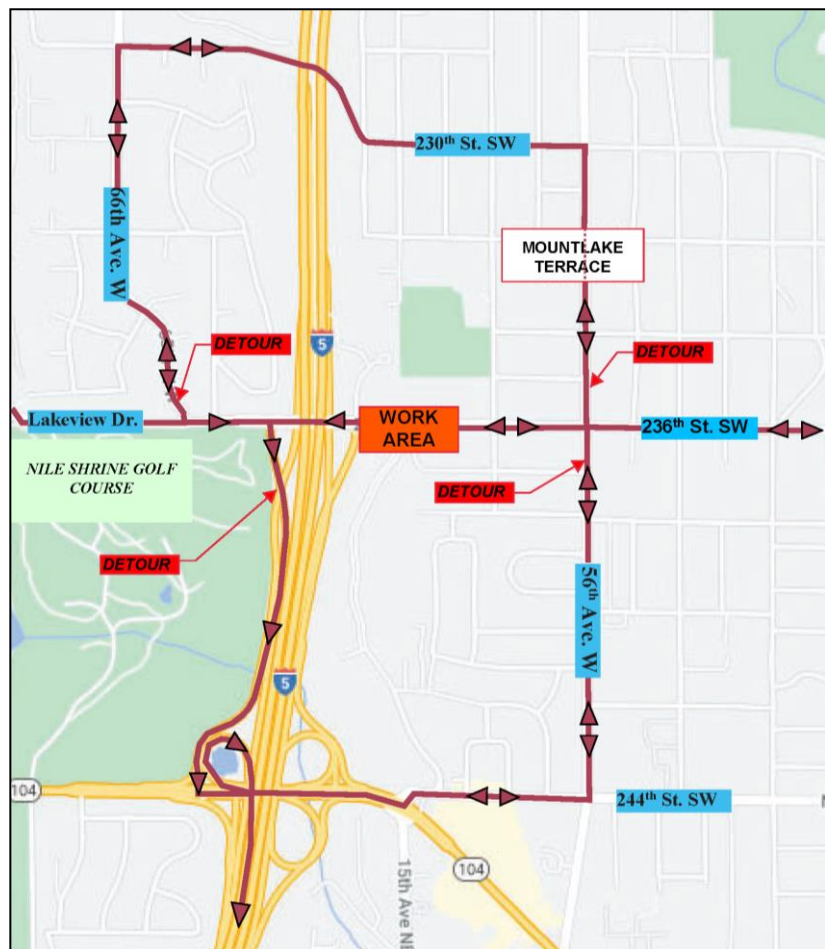
and use, along with potential conditions. If the site becomes a viable option, state law requires DOC to conduct a public hearing process, which includes notification to all addresses within a half-mile radius of the site.

The city has invited the Department of Corrections' Project Team to speak to the Mountlake Terrace community about this proposal and answer questions, so please watch for updates as we work to confirm a date and time. Learn more information about the state's work release program [online](#).

- **236th Street SW Weekday Night Closures:** Over the next two weeks, Sound Transit will continue evening work at 236th Street SW and the northbound I-5 off-ramp on the elevated trackway for the Lynnwood Link Extension Light Rail Project. Nightly closures and detours will be in effect from 8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. from Monday-Thursday, August 2-5 and August 9-12. **(Please note 8:00 p.m. start time.)**

Detours will be in effect during that time (see map) and emergency vehicles and buses will be allowed through the closure. During the closure, westbound vehicles will be redirected to turn north on 56th Avenue W, west onto 230th Street W, south on 66th Avenue W and continue on to Lakeview Drive. Eastbound vehicles will be redirected south on I-5, east on 244th Street SW, and north on 56th Avenue W.

The contractor has obtained a Temporary Noise Variance. Work begins at 8:00 p.m., so plan ahead, leave early, and allow extra time to reach your destination and be prepared for delays while this work takes place.

- **City Newsletter:** The August issue of [City Happenings](#) was mailed last week and features an update on the Ballinger Waterfront project that is currently underway. Additional articles in this issue include the state Department of Corrections evaluating a potential work release facility site in Mountlake Terrace near the Edmonds border (see update above), American Rescue Plan Act Funds, Premera Blue Cross Campus Renovation, new utility billing vendor, and funding for big improvements at Evergreen Playfield Complex.
- **Update on City Hall Reopening:** With the Governor's announcement on June 30, the state kicked off "Washington Ready," the next chapter of the state's COVID-19 response, and the state has fully reopened. In accordance with state and county health recommendations, individuals who are not yet vaccinated for COVID-19 are encouraged to get vaccinated. Additionally, everyone is urged to continue practicing good hygiene and taking measures to keep our community safe as COVID-19 cases are beginning to surge again.

In late June, City Hall operations moved from the interim location to the newly constructed building at 23204 58th Avenue W. Although we have fully moved in, the contractor is still working on a list of remaining items before the project is deemed complete. Also, the city is still securing lobby and plaza furniture, décor, and signage and working to make our house feel like a home for the community.

We are now preparing City Hall for reopening, including planning for in-person or hybrid public meetings and training on new audio/visual equipment. When the city does fully reopen, we will require unvaccinated individuals to wear a mask inside city facilities until further notice.

Planning for a grand opening event and community celebration is in progress, however the date has not yet been confirmed. Please watch for updates and we will provide more information once that date is certain.

- **Small Business Flex Fund Loans:** On June 30, a program was launched for small business owners and nonprofits across Washington to apply for low interest loans of up to \$150,000 supported by the Washington State Department of Commerce. The fund is a public-private partnership aimed at helping small businesses and nonprofits (particularly those in low-income communities) recover and grow as communities across the state reopen for business. - **Evictions Moratorium and Ban on Utility Shutoffs:** In March, the Governor issued a [Proclamation](#) extending Washington State's moratorium on evictions through September 30, 2021. The moratorium is intended to protect tenants who have fallen behind on their rent because of the economic downturn that arrived with the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, the Governor [extended provisions](#) to ban shutting off utility services to those behind on their payments through September 30. - **Public Access to City Facilities:** Following Governor Inslee's announcement in late June to broaden activities during the pandemic, staff are working on a policy to return to in-person services at City Hall, the Police Station and the Public Works Shop.

The Recreation Pavilion hours are Monday-Thursday, 5:45 a.m.-8:30 p.m. and Friday 5:45 a.m.-6:30 p.m. The facility is not open on the weekend. Email mltrecreation@mltwa.gov or call 425-776-9173 to register or get more information about our programs. Athletic fields are open by reservation only and with appropriate safety plans. Park trails, off-leash dog park, tennis courts and basketball court are open.

Police fines and payments may be placed in the Police Station payment box outside the station or mailed to 5906 232nd Street SW, Mountlake Terrace. City utility payments may be placed in the drop box outside City Hall, mailed, or paid [online](#).

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- **Permits:** Until the city re-opens for in-person services, all [permit applications](#) are accepted through a 'no-contact' procedure. Note: Permit processing times have increased due to compliance with COVID-19 mandates. Call 425-775-9694 to schedule an inspection and have your permit number and address ready. Your project must have issued permits on-site, require workers to be six-feet apart, and have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan (Washington State Department of Labor & Industries will enforce requirements for contractors to comply). Please email Permitspecialist@mltwa.gov with questions.

- City Website Portal: Single Family (Electrical, Mechanical, Plumbing, Roof, Sewer, Repair/New, and Window Replacement Only).
- Mail/Drop-off: Building (Minor Exterior Work Only to Include Roof Overlay or Re-Roof; and Siding and/or Windows); Communication/Utility Companies; Deck; Demolition; Driveway; Fence; Fire Prevention; Shed; Solar; Violation/Investigation; Wall/Rockery; and Water Meter. Note: The Development Permit intake box is located by the front door to City Hall during business hours. A permit specialist will be in contact with confirmation of receipt, and invoice fees due, to begin processing.
- Appointments Required: Civil; Commercial/Multi-Family Building; Fire Alarm; Fire Sprinkler; Land Use; Low Voltage Electrical, Commercial; New Construction or Addition; Plumbing/Electrical/Mechanical Plan Review; Single Family Building Addition or Remodel; and Tenant Improvement.

FINANCE

- **New Utility Billing Vendor Selected:** On June 21 the City Council approved a contract with Output Services Group, Inc. (OSG) for utility billing services. The contract with OSG comes following a cyber-attack on the systems of the city's current billing provider, AFTS, which shut down much of the utility billing services.

In response to input from the community, the new contract will include services not previously offered by AFTS. OSG services include text, email and phone notification of new bills, late notices, and payments; auto pay; pay as a guest option; and better tracking of when the statements are mailed by OSG and returned to the payment processing center.

OSG is also establishing payment sites with stores like CVS and 7-Eleven so that customers can make payments when it is most convenient for them. The \$2.00 fee for credit card payments that was in the prior contract will not continue in the contract with OSG. The new contract is approximately \$30,000 *less* per year than.

Since moving into the new City Hall, a utility bill payments drop box has been installed near the front entrance located at 23204 58th Avenue W (see photo). Customers may walk or drive up to the drop box.

- **Relief Due to COVID-19 Emergency:** Since March 19, 2020, water service is not being shut off for residential customers' inability to pay during the COVID-19 emergency. The action remains in effect under the state's most recent proclamations addressing the pandemic. No late fees or penalties will apply during this time.

The service fee charged by the vendor for online utility payments has also been suspended for those choosing to pay online. The city recognizes that COVID-19 is a threat to the health of the community, and the ability to frequently wash our hands is paramount in the fight to

curb the spread of the virus. As called for by the state and Snohomish Health District, this step will enable the community to ensure proper cleaning measures. We encourage customers to continue to make their payments or to contact Utility Billing at utilitybilling@mltwa.gov or 425-744-6214 or to make payment arrangements, if they are unable to pay at this time.

- **Ballinger Park Water Elements Project:** The water elements project has begun at the Ballinger Park Boat Launch. The project includes a new fishing pier, floating boat dock and boat ramp. The in-water construction work will occur in July and August, and upland work will conclude in September.
