CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to limit the spread of COVID-19, the city continues to follow Governor Inslee's [Proclamation 20-28](#) by holding City Council meetings virtually (online), via Zoom.

The City Council's **Wednesday, November 10 special work/study session** ([Meeting link](#) | Passcode 111021), beginning at 7:00 p.m., via telephone and internet, agenda includes: (1) Introduction of Stormwater Code Updates Ordinance; and (2) Review of Mid-Biennial Budget Modifications. **Note: this meeting is on Wednesday due to Thursday's Veterans Day holiday.**

The City Council's **Thursday, November 11 work/study session**, is **cancelled** due to Veterans Day holiday.

CITY CLERK AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS

- **Trunk-or-Treat:** The Mountlake Terrace Business Association held its annual Trunk-or-Treat event on Sunday, October 31 at the parking lot near the corner of 56th Avenue W and 232nd Street SW. The City of Mountlake Terrace Police Department participated by hosting a trunk with officers present and city employees contributed funds to purchase candy for the event. Thanks to Espresso Break and the Mountlake Terrace Business Association for hosting this event!
- **Adopt-A-Drain Program:** Clearing storm drains protects water quality and prevents flooding. With the rainy season here, the City of Mountlake Terrace is welcoming new volunteers for the Adopt-A-Drain program. If you decide to adopt a drain (or multiple!) nearby, you agree to remove accumulated debris from your storm drain from October through March. Then you'll contact the city's Stormwater Program Manager with the time you spend keeping our water clean. - **Night Work Along I-5 and State Route 104 Interchange:** Tuesday, November 9, Sound Transit's contractor will work at night along the I-5 and the SR 104 Interchange in Shoreline to complete a concrete pour for the elevated guideway for the future Lynnwood Link Extension. This work will include an overnight closure (10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.) of the on-ramp from Eastbound SR 104. A detour will be provided (see map for the full closure detour). The contractor has obtained a Temporary Noise Variance to complete this work. This work is weather-dependent and may need to be rescheduled.

- **Lodging Tax Grant Applications Due November 10:** Financial support is available for organizations planning community events and festivals in Mountlake Terrace. The city has \$25,000 in lodging tax funds available to qualified applicants for projects and events that promote tourism in 2022. These funds come from the taxes collected from Studio 6 Hotel in Mountlake Terrace.

Lodging tax funds must be used for marketing or operation of special events designed to attract tourists from more than 50 miles away. They may also support the operations of tourism-related facilities owned or operated by nonprofit organizations according to law.

Programs or events should have the potential to increase overnight visits to Studio 6 and/or create a positive economic impact. Lodging tax funds have helped support community events such as the 3rd of July Fireworks event, Tour de Terrace and Arts of the Terrace.

- **Before/After Photos Show Taylor Pond Restoration:** The city recently completed a water quality project to revitalize Taylor Pond, a regional stormwater detention pond originally constructed in 1979 and updated in 1988. Taylor Pond is located at the intersection of 216th Street SW and 66th Avenue W, just upstream of Hall Creek, a key tributary to Lake Ballinger. Before this summer, the pond's surface was barely visible beneath a tangle of shoulder-high blackberry vines, cattails and grasses.

Detention ponds protect creeks and lakes by allowing suspended pollutants to settle and by storing water during storms. Over the years, Taylor Pond had filled with sediment and no longer was able to remove pollutants washed away from streets and parking lots.

The pond is on private property, but the city has an easement for maintenance. The City Council identified cleaning Taylor Pond as a priority in 2018, but work began this year as funding became available. The recent work removed 1,220 cubic yards of sediment from the pond, improved the design for easier maintenance, and added native wetland plants. - **Update on City Hall Reopening:** With the continued high level of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, combined with the contractor continuing to complete the list of items to finish the project, City Hall and the Police Station remain closed to the public for in-person business with the exception of appointments related to specific services. The city will continue to monitor health recommendations from the county and state and plan for reopening for in-person services once the City Hall project is completed and health precautions allow.
- **Small Business Flex Fund Loans:** On June 30, a program was launched for small business owners and nonprofits across Washington to apply for low interest loans of up to \$150,000 supported by the Washington State Department of Commerce. The fund is a public-private partnership aimed at helping small businesses and nonprofits (particularly those in low-income communities) recover and grow as communities across the state reopen for business. - **Permits:** Until the city re-opens for in-person services, [permit applications](#) are accepted through a 'no-contact' procedure. Permit processing times have increased due to compliance with COVID mandates. Call 425-775-9694 to schedule an inspection and have your permit number and address ready. During your work, permits must be on-site, workers must following COVID-19 protocols, and contractors must have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan (Department of Labor & Industries will enforce requirements for contractors to comply). FINANCE

- **Utility Billing Vendor:** On June 21, the City Council approved a contract with Output Services Group, Inc. (OSG) for utility billing services. The contract with OSG comes

following a cyber-attack on the systems of the city's current billing provider, AFTS, which shut down much of the utility billing services.

In response to input from the community, the new contract will include services not previously offered by AFTS. OSG services include text, email and phone notification of new bills, late notices, and payments; auto pay; pay as a guest option; and better tracking of when the statements are mailed by OSG and returned to the payment processing center. OSG is also establishing payment sites with stores like CVS and 7-Eleven so that customers can make payments when it is most convenient for them. There is no longer a \$2.00 fee for credit card payments. The new contract is approximately \$30,000 *less* per year.

- **Thanksgiving Modified Schedule:** The Recreation Pavilion will have a modified schedule for the holiday from November 24-27, there are no swimming lessons during this timeframe.

On Wednesday, November 24 all morning fitness classes will meet, a recreation swim has been added from 4:45-6:15 p.m., and the building will close at 6:30 p.m. On Thursday, November 25 the Pavilion will be closed for Thanksgiving. On Friday, November 26, the building will open at 5:45 a.m. with most morning fitness classes meeting, with the exception of the 9:20 a.m. Shallow Water Class. A varying number of lap lanes will be available from 5:45 a.m.-2:30 p.m. At 4:45 p.m. on Friday, a Recreation Swim will be offered.
