CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

In order to limit the spread of COVID-19, the city continues to follow Governor Inslee's [Proclamation 20-28](#) by holding City Council meetings virtually (online), via Zoom.

CITY CLERK AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS

- **Drive-Through Food Pantry Event:** A food pantry pop-up took place Saturday afternoon in the Mountlake Terrace Town Center. The event was sponsored by Volunteers of America Western Washington, with assistance from the city and other organizations. A similar pop-up was held here in August 2020 and served roughly 129 households. Traditionally, the holidays are a busy time for food banks. Some households are being affected by the end of state and federal pandemic relief programs so these pop up events help provide additional assistance.

- **Snohomish County Cold Weather Shelters: (Shared from Snohomish County website)** Multiple locations in Snohomish County provide overnight shelter during dangerously cold weather. These shelters are operated by community-based organizations, volunteer groups, and communities of faith across Snohomish County. Hours of operation, criteria for opening, and length of season vary by location. Cold Weather Shelters typically open when overnight temperatures are expected to be below freezing (under 32 degrees F). [This page](#) is updated as needed throughout the cold weather season. During periods of below-freezing weather, expect the site to be updated often with shelter openings and closures. Questions about a specific shelter should be directed to that shelter. Please note that COVID-19 precautions will be taken at all shelters, which may cause changes at shelters and in transportation resources. Youths between the ages of 12-17 years of age who need shelter may call 425-877-5171.
- **Volunteer for the Recreation and Parks Commission!:** If you would like to play a role in the future of Mountlake Terrace recreation programs and park projects, the City of Mountlake Terrace has a vacancy on its Recreation and Parks Advisory Commission (RPAC). The seven-member Advisory Commission promotes the use of recreation facilities and programs, participates in city-wide special events and volunteer park projects including playground installations, park clean-up activities, maintaining communication with subcommittees, and other related volunteer organizations.

The RPAC meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Currently, the meetings are being conducted via Zoom, with the option to participate by telephone. When it is safe to do so, the meetings will resume in person at the Recreation Pavilion. The remainder of this vacant term expires June 30, 2023. Future appointments will have a term of three years. Applicants must be residents of Mountlake Terrace and the city encourages people of diverse backgrounds to apply. - **Adopt-A-Drain Program:** Clearing storm drains protects water quality and prevents flooding. With the rainy season here, the City of Mountlake Terrace is welcoming new volunteers for the Adopt-A-Drain program. If you decide to adopt a drain (or multiple!) nearby, you agree to remove accumulated debris from your storm drain from October through March. Then you'll contact the city's Stormwater Program Manager with the time you spend keeping our water clean. - **Update on City Hall Reopening:** With the continued high level of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, combined with the contractor continuing to complete the list of items to finish the project, City Hall and the Police Station remain closed to the public for in-person business with the exception of appointments related to specific services. The city will continue to monitor health recommendations from the county and state and plan for reopening for in-person services once the City Hall project is completed and health precautions allow.
- **Before/After Photos Show Taylor Pond Restoration:** The city recently completed a water quality project to revitalize Taylor Pond, a regional stormwater detention pond originally constructed in 1979 and updated in 1988. Taylor Pond is located at the intersection of 216th Street SW and 66th Avenue W, just upstream of Hall Creek, a key tributary to Lake Ballinger. Before this summer, the pond’s surface was barely visible beneath a tangle of shoulder-high blackberry vines, cattails and grasses.

Detention ponds protect creeks and lakes by allowing suspended pollutants to settle and by storing water during storms. Over the years, Taylor Pond had filled with sediment and no longer was able to remove pollutants washed away from streets and parking lots.

The pond is on private property, but the city has an easement for maintenance. The City Council identified cleaning Taylor Pond as a priority in 2018, but work began this year as funding became available. The recent work removed 1,220 cubic yards of sediment from the pond, improved the design for easier maintenance, and added native wetland plants. - **Small Business Flex Fund Loans:** On June 30, a program was launched for small business owners and nonprofits across Washington to apply for low interest loans of up to \$150,000 supported by the Washington State Department of Commerce. The fund is a public-private partnership aimed at helping small businesses and nonprofits (particularly those in low-

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- **Permits:** Until the city re-opens for in-person services, [permit applications](#) are accepted through a ‘no-contact’ procedure. Permit processing times have increased due to compliance with COVID mandates. Call 425-775-9694 to schedule an inspection and have your permit number and address ready. During construction work, permits must be on-site, workers must be following COVID-19 protocols, and contractors must have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan (the Washington Department of Labor & Industries enforces these requirements for contractors). FINANCE

- **Utility Billing Vendor:** On June 21, the City Council approved a contract with Output Services Group, Inc. (OSG) for utility billing services. The contract with OSG comes following a cyber-attack on the systems of the city's current billing provider, AFTS, which shut down much of the utility billing services.

In response to input from the community, the new contract will include services not previously offered by AFTS. OSG services include text, email and phone notification of new bills, late notices, and payments; auto pay; pay as a guest option; and better tracking of when the statements are mailed by OSG and returned to the payment processing center. OSG is also establishing payment sites with stores like CVS and 7-Eleven so that customers can make payments when it is most convenient for them. There is no longer a \$2.00 fee for credit card payments. The new contract is approximately \$30,000 *less* per year.
