#### **CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS**

In order to limit the spread of COVID-19, the city continues to follow Governor Inslee's [Proclamation 20-28](#) by holding City Council meetings virtually (online), via Zoom.

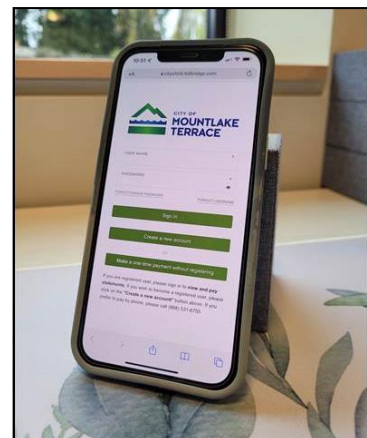

The City Council's **Thursday, December 30 work/study session**, is tentatively **cancelled** due to the New Year's holiday being recognized on Friday, December 31, with city offices closed that day.

#### **CITY CLERK AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS**

- **New Utility Bill Online Access With Autopay:** Mountlake Terrace utility customers can access their water/sewer/stormwater bill [online](#) and set up automatic payments and more. This new service also offers payment notifications by text, email and phone. In addition, there is no fee for online payments made through the new vendor, Output Services Group (OSG).

Additional online features include the ability to view usage and billing history, and are expected to roll out in the near future. Residents who prefer to pay by telephone, mail or the drop box at City Hall still have those options.



- **Utility Repayment Program:** Customers who have fallen behind on utility payments during the pandemic have the opportunity to sign up for a repayment plan to avoid termination of services. They are encouraged to get in touch before December 17, to allow time for processing. This week, the City Council unanimously approved a repayment program that allows those customers up to 18 months to catch up. The city also is working on a partnership with the Volunteers of America Western Washington that potentially would use federal stimulus dollars to assist those who qualify.

The 18-month timeline allows an additional year of grace beyond what is required by the state Legislature. For about 19 months, the city has followed the state's temporary rules against shutting off water for nonpayment. Those rules expired at the end of September, and cities around the state have been making plans to resolve utility debts. By law, the city is obligated to recoup the costs of water service and cannot "gift" city dollars for that purpose. The repayment program is a carefully considered solution designed to help residents get back in good standing while avoiding water shut-off. If a household does not make these arrangements, the city's next option is to seek a lien on the property for the unpaid amount.

Customers who enroll in the repayment program and keep up with their plan may become eligible for future financial assistance through the city's partnership with Volunteers of America. The City Council is scheduled to discuss the proposal at the Dec. 16 work/study session. This assistance would come from the city's allotted share of the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021. - **New Tree Displayed in Jerry Smith Town Center Plaza:** A wireless carrier project at Jack Long Park means the city will not be lighting the tree atop the water tower this year. However, on December 3 the city installed a 20-foot artificial tree in the Jerry Smith Town Center Plaza at 23204 58<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. We hope to have an in-person Tree Lighting Ceremony next year when the pandemic is behind us.

- **Update on City Hall Reopening:** With the continued high level of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, combined with the contractor continuing to complete the list of items to finish the project, City Hall and the Police Station remain closed to the public for in-person business with the exception of appointments related to specific services. The city will continue to monitor health recommendations from the county and state and plan for reopening for in-person services once the City Hall project is completed and health precautions allow.
- **Small Business Flex Fund Loans:** On June 30, a program was launched for small business owners and nonprofits across Washington to apply for low interest loans of up to \$150,000 supported by the Washington State Department of Commerce. The fund is a public-private partnership aimed at helping small businesses and nonprofits (particularly those in low-income communities) recover and grow as communities across the state reopen for business. **Weekly Patrol Synopsis**

- There were four vehicle prowls this week: 23200 block of 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue W; 5100 block of 212<sup>th</sup> Street SW; 4200 block of 236<sup>th</sup> Street SW; and 23300 block of 46<sup>th</sup> Place W.
- There was one vehicle theft this week: 21300 block of 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue W.
- There was one warrant arrest this week: 23300 block of Highway 99.
- There was one vehicle recovery this week: 5400 block of 242<sup>nd</sup> Street SW.
- Two mail thefts were reported in the 4500 block of 241<sup>st</sup> Ct. There are no suspects or leads.
- On December 1, officers responded to an elderly male who thought he was hit by a vehicle. After further investigation, the male subject appeared to have fallen and was confused. He was transported to the hospital.
- While detectives were investigating an unrelated crime, they came across a female subject sleeping in her vehicle in a public parking lot. While checking her welfare, detectives learned that the female had warrants for her arrest. The detectives explained that she was under arrest and told the female to exit her vehicle. The female stated that she would not comply, started her vehicle and then drove away. The female was cited, through the prosecutor, for obstructing a police officer.
- On December 2, a domestic assault occurred between a former boyfriend and girlfriend who have a child in common. Probable cause was developed to charge the male subject who had already fled the area. The case has been forwarded to the prosecutor.
- On December 2, officers conducted a search, with consent, of a vehicle during a traffic stop. Officers found several pieces of drug paraphernalia and a small amount of controlled substances. The suspect was not arrested, and was given recourses for substance abuse counseling.
- A burglary was reported in the 22700 block of 49<sup>th</sup> Place W. The home was under construction and several construction tools were stolen. The case has been assigned to detectives.
- A hit-and-run was reported in the 23100 block of 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue W.
- A package was stolen from a porch in the 23400 block of 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. There are no suspects or leads.
- A court order violation was reported in the 5600 block of 220<sup>th</sup> Street SW. Upon officers' arrival the parties involved would not cooperate with police.
- A hit-and run-was reported in the 22700 block of 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. Investigation is ongoing.

- There was a report of an attempted vehicle theft in the 4300 block of 236<sup>th</sup> Street SW. There are no suspects or leads at this time.
- A physical domestic was reported in the 24200 block of 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. Upon arrival officers contacted an uncooperative male and female who were in a dating relationship. Even though the subjects were uncooperative, probable cause was developed to arrest the male suspect for Assault 4 – Domestic Violence.
- A residential burglary was reported in the 23400 block of 53<sup>rd</sup> Avenue W. There are no suspects or leads at this time.
- A ladder was stolen from the 4800 block of 219<sup>th</sup> Street SW. The case is still under investigation.
- An unknown subject stole license plates from a vehicle in the 22700 block of Lakeview Drive.
- Suspicious activity, “dangerous, sinister males,” were reported in the 23600 block of Cedar Way by an unknown caller. Nothing suspicious was found.
- A mailbox was stolen from the 23000 block of 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. There are no suspects at this time.

### **Significant Incidents**

- Patrol responded to a video alarm of the Terrace Station construction site. The alarm company reported seeing a male inside the fenced construction site. Containment was set and Edmonds police responded with a K9 unit. The suspect was seen by officers as they entered the site. Orders were given to the suspect that he was under arrest and to stop. He fled on foot north through a ravine. The K9 track was strong and led to a hole in some bushes. The track recovered items discarded by the suspect. The track led to an area on 238<sup>th</sup> Street SW where the trail went cold and the suspect was not located. Investigation is ongoing.
- Officers responded to a suspicious circumstance, where a resident had found a gate open and foot prints on the property. Upon arrival officers had brief contact with a suspicious male near a car parked in front of the house on the street. There was no probable cause to detain the male.

As the male left in his vehicle, officers ran the license plate, which returned stolen out of Seattle. Officers relocated the vehicle and attempted to stop it on 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue W at 214<sup>th</sup> Street SW. The vehicle continued at normal speeds for a brief time before accelerating to a high rate of speed and fleeing. The vehicle was not pursued. Additional investigation at the scene revealed the suspect stole a gas can from the property.

- A patrol officer attempted a traffic stop on a vehicle with a stolen license plate. The vehicle fled, striking the patrol car in the process. The vehicle proceeded in an unknown direction



and was not relocated. There was no pursuit initiated and the officer was not injured. The patrol car sustained minor damage and was taken out of service. Edmonds police completed the collision investigation and video evidence of the driver was obtained. Investigation is ongoing.

The notice lists the specific dates and times both Patrol and Code Enforcement have been involved with the vehicle.



Code Enforcement contacted the registered owner and explained the vehicle was no longer allowed to be parked anywhere on the city's public streets beyond December 7 at 9:00 a.m. or the vehicle will be impounded without further notice.
