- **Tour de Terrace Returns July 22-24:** Mark your calendars for Tour de Terrace, one of the best family festivals of Seafair. This three-day community event kicks off Friday, July 22, with a popular parade.

At about 7 p.m., the Tour de Terrace Parade takes off with fan favorites including the Seafair pirates and clowns, drill teams, dancers, floats, trucks, classic cars and more.

The parade travels along "Main Street" (56th Avenue W) from 234th Street, north to 222nd Street and Evergreen Playfield. Everyone should expect road closures along the road well into the evening.

Among the Tour de Terrace highlights are live music and entertainment, a beer garden, food booths, pancake breakfast, street fair, carnival, and the classic car, truck and motorcycle show (Car show is Saturday only: 9 a.m.-3 p.m.). ## **COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

- **Inspection Requests Available Exclusively Online:** All inspections are required to be requested via the [Permit Portal](#). The city continues to make an effort to provide consistency and expedite the inspection scheduling process. Consolidating permits and inspections through the portal streamlines this progression.

The former Inspection Hotline redirects callers to the online portal. Additionally, all permit information is housed online, in the same place, and can be accessed by the permit number. Information regarding the necessity of inspections, and staying in compliance with the accompanying permits, is explained on the [Permits & Licenses](#) page.

- **Permits:** Until the city re-opens for in-person services, [permit applications](#) are accepted through a 'no-contact' procedure. Permit processing times have increased due to compliance with COVID mandates. During construction, permits must be on-site, workers must follow COVID-19 protocols, and contractors must have a developed exposure control, mitigation, and recovery plan. - **Youth Day at Lake Ballinger - It's Getting Hotter - Let's Keep Our Waters Cool**  
As summer heats up, our local streams and lakes help us cool off. But are we returning the favor? Join us at Lake Ballinger on **July 16<sup>th</sup> from 10 am to noon** to learn how you and your family can protect the lakes and streams around you—as well as the people, plants, and animals that enjoy them, too! At Youth Day you'll participate in the following:
  - **Make seed balls:** Learn how to make your very own native seed balls using clay, soil, water, and seeds. Once they dry, you can toss them in your garden to help native plants grow.
  - **Play the poop toss game:** Have a little friendly com-poo-tition with your friends and family as you learn how to properly dispose of pet waste to make sure it doesn't harm local water quality.

- **See a soil filtration demo:** Observe just how well healthy soils and native plants can filter stormwater so fewer pollutants go into our rivers, streams, and lakes.
- **Take part in a scavenger hunt:** See if you can spot local plants and animals around Lake Ballinger. Bring back a completed scavenger hunt checklist and take home a prize!
- **Test Lake Ballinger's water quality:** Check on the health of Lake Ballinger by doing water quality tests using samples gathered from the lake. Do you think salmon would survive here?
- **Hang a drawing in our salmon art gallery:** After learning about the five special salmon species that live in the Puget Sound Watershed, color in your own salmon and hang up your work of art in our salmon gallery!
- **Watch a watershed in action:** Check out how water (and pollutants) travel through a watershed and see what you can add to our watershed model to make sure stormwater is as clean as possible before it hits the Puget Sound.
